## 1 Corinthians Chapter 11:1-34

The next section of 1 Corinthians deals with public assemblies (11-14). There were abuses at Corinth that needed to be corrected. In chapter 11 Paul deals with the subjection of women (1-16) and the Lord's supper (17-34).

- 2. What did it mean for a woman to have her head "uncovered" and how did people know this (11:5, 6)?
- 3. What are two abuses of the Lord's supper that were present at Corinth (11:17-22)?
- 4. What do we learn about one of the purposes of assembling from 11:20 (cf. Acts 20:7)?
- 5. List the actions and elements of the Lord's supper (11:23-26).
- 6. What does it mean to partake of the Lord's supper in an "unworthy manner" (11:27)?
- 7. Where are we to eat to satisfy hunger and what does it mean in this context (11:34)?
